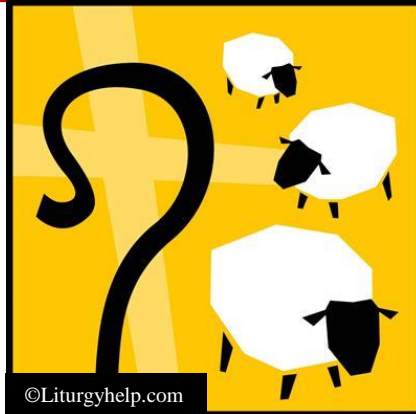

Dear Parishioners,

The risen Lord says to us today, "I am the good shepherd. I know my sheep and mine know me (John 10:14)." Today is commonly known as Good Shepherd Sunday, celebrated today on the fourth Sunday of Easter, at exactly the midpoint of the Easter season. There are countless images of Jesus, and today, it is the image of the good

shepherd that we are invited to reflect on. Of all the tribes and peoples in Jesus' time, Jesus longed to unite God's people like a flock under one shepherd. Therefore, Jesus uses the care that a shepherd has for their sheep as the analogy for the love that God has for God's people.

Not only does this mean that He desires we be united as one people, but He also desires to be our primary navigator in our lives. We have many influences, including family and friends, and culture. Our culture influences who we are and how we perceive the world and our surroundings. We are influenced by our cultural norms and values, as well as long term traditions that have been part of our routine for years. These influences are shepherds in our lives – the very things that guide our thoughts and actions. Of all these shepherds, those that are good and those that are bad, Jesus wants to be our primary shepherd.

He loves and cares for us like a shepherd who cares for their sheep. He cares about where we go and is deeply concerned for us when we breach the boundaries of the field. A shepherd keeps their flock in the field because he knows it is the place where they are safe. It is not a field that restricts us, but one that frees us. When we strive to live the life that Jesus wants, we find freedom. We do not feel restricted within His boundaries, but experience freedom because we are living within His intimate love and care for us.

Of all the shepherds in our lives, let us give first place to the one who calls Himself the Good Shepherd. This can often mean that our ways of doing things can be challenged, but He challenges them so that we can live more in His love and grace. Of the many voices influencing our decisions and the way we live, let us listen ever more deeply to the one voice who knows better than the others, the way for us to live and the ways for us to go.



CORPUS CHRISTI PROCESSION

"Whoever follows me walks not in darkness" (John 8:12)

Corpus Christi Procession will be on **Sunday 2 June at 2pm starting from St Stephen's Cathedral.**

On the Feast of Corpus Christi, the Catholic Church honours the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist, *"For my flesh is real food and my blood is real drink" (John 6.55)*. Processing with the Blessed Sacrament through the streets is a tradition that is embraced all over the world and continues today.

In the Archdiocese of Brisbane, we will bear witness to our faith on 2nd June 2024, as we gather with over 5000 Catholics to walk with Jesus through the streets of Brisbane City, as we pray, sing, praise and honour Him in the Blessed Sacrament. The Corpus Christi Procession, presided by Archbishop Mark Coleridge will start a 2pm from the Cathedral of St Stephen, walk through the city streets and finish with Benediction at the Cathedral. In addition to the procession, **an exhibition of Eucharistic Miracles around the world** will be on display in the **Hanley Room**, Francis Rush Centre, from Saturday 1st to Sunday 2nd June. There will be also a **vigil of Adoration** in St Stephen's Chapel overnight from 7pm Saturday 1st June – Sunday 2nd June. Come along with your family and parish group.
