# STAR NEWS 5 May 2024

Dear Parishioners,

Many of us find inspiration through the lives of the saints. They are indeed people who we believe are in heaven, and people who lived holy lives - lives that we aspire to imitate. We see in the first reading from Acts, the rapport that Peter had with Cornelius and the people gathered in Cornelius' home.

They were all amazed at what Peter told them about Spirit being with the Holy anybody who

acknowledged its presence, including the pagans. This led many to being baptised and the people gathered insisted that he stay with them for a longer time, and why wouldn't they? Peter was a man who had the Holy Spirit with him, and this same spirit came down on all who were listening (Acts 10:44). What a moment of captivation this would have been for them.

We now of course know Peter as Saint Peter, and celebrate his feast day along with Saint Paul on 29 June. Peter's missionary zeal and witness, despite his many failings, is certainly a life we can imitate in our own way today. But perhaps one of the biggest pitfalls of embracing the lives of the saints is to put them in place of Jesus Himself. We see Cornelius move towards this, as he "knelt at Peter's feet and prostrated himself (Acts 10:25)." Peter gives him the most appropriate reply and says, "Stand up, I am only a man after all (Acts 10:26)."

The saints are people who led holy lives, but only because they chose to. They were not that way from birth, but were presented with the choice to embrace the love of God more each day. Even the saints themselves said that they are sinners, in need of God's love and forgiveness. The reached their sainthood because they embraced it so well, and picked themselves up when they failed. Their trust in God, and God's healing and redemptive power was unquestionable. Saints, like Peter, are people like us, who have given us fine examples of how we can not only get to heaven, but get ourselves back on the road to it when we wander off. Peter was the man who denied Jesus three times. and yet today, we listen to him amaze the crowd, filled with the Holy Spirit.

Let us be inspired by the saints and let the choices they made be ours in our way today. Let us always remember though, that they point to the one who is truly worthy of our praise - Jesus. If they can walk the journey with Him, as imperfect as they were, and find their true life through Him, may we too, filled with the Holy Spirit, do the same. Many blessings for the week ahead!




# INVITATION

In addition to the procession, an exhibition of Eucharistic Miracles around the world will be on display in the Hanley **Room**, Francis Rush Centre, from Saturday 1<sup>st</sup> to Sunday 2<sup>nd</sup> June.
